
Speaking And Writing Strategies For The TOEFL IBT

Task 2 (Integrated Speaking):

- You will listen to a short academic passage for up to 90 seconds.
- You will then read a short text related to the passage for 60 seconds.
- Finally, you will have 90 seconds to summarize and discuss the information from both sources.

Task 3 (Independent Speaking):

- You will be presented with a topic and two points of view.
- You will have 20 seconds to read the topic and points of view.
- You will then have 45 seconds to prepare your response.
- Finally, you will have 45 seconds to deliver your speech.

Task 4 (Integrated Speaking):

- You will listen to an academic lecture for up to 1 minute 30 seconds.
- You will then see a question about the lecture for 45 seconds.
- Finally, you will have 90 seconds to answer the question.
- Practice regularly: Engage in frequent speaking exercises to improve your fluency and accuracy.

- Study vocabulary and grammar: Expand your vocabulary and strengthen your grammar skills to enhance your ability to express yourself clearly.
- Listen to native English speakers: Pay attention to the pronunciation, intonation, and speech patterns of native speakers.
- Use accurate grammar and pronunciation: Pay attention to verb tenses, articles, and pronunciation to improve the clarity of your speech.

Task 1 (Integrated Writing):


- You will read a short academic passage for up to 3 minutes.

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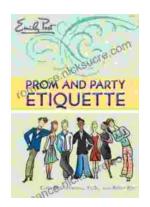
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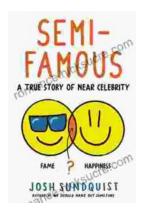
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
